## Rail bridge removal

Following consultation with the relevant authorities for the Moama to Moulamein railway line, permission has been granted to remove the railway bridge at the top of the Mallan 1 channel (Moulamein Area). This bridge has been a system constraint for a long time and has been a limiting factor for landholders when planning their irrigation programs. This is a great outcome for landholders in this area and is in line with our strategy to remove redundant infrastructure.

We are continuing to work with rail owners across the footprint to determine whether there are other assets which we may be able to be removed.

## Water delivery – high demand

### What to expect and how best to manage your water orders:

- It is vital that customers place orders as early as possible.
- 4 days' notice is required to guarantee your supply date.
- Customers should continue to place water orders directly into the online water ordering system.
- If you are offered a later delivery date than expected you can lodge an unsatisfied order or send a message via the water ordering system.
- It is likely that high demand will limit the ability to deliver orders early. The ability to support customer requests outside of normal operating times may also be reduced.
