Currently there are over 20 Murray Irrigation customers across the footprint at risk of being charged casual Usage for over 4000ML of water delivered due to a DE shortfall. ## Discharging water into Murray Irrigation's supply/drainage system

Customers must have prior approval to discharge water into Murray Irrigation's drainage or supply system. Drainage water must be delivered through a drainage inlet and will require a water test. Please complete [this form](#), available on our website, for approval to discharge water into the system.

## Asset Rationalisation Project

Murray Irrigation will be continuing to work with customers, to remove redundant infrastructure in the field. This initiative is intended to reduce further asset maintenance and replacement costs into the future.

In 2021 we were able to negotiate with customers the removal of over \$500K worth of underutilised assets from across the footprint.

The benefit of this ongoing project greatly reduces future costs for everyone.
